**ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER # 2018-00-06**

**RE: JUDGE JOE GRAMMER APPOINTED AS  
THE COURT'S LIAISON TO THE BAY COUNTY JAIL**

**Whereas**, the Chief Judge of each judicial circuit, pursuant to Section 43.26, Florida Statutes, shall exercise administrative supervision over all the trial courts within the judicial circuit and over the judges and other officers of such courts;

**Whereas**, the Chief Judge of the Fourteenth Judicial Circuit, pursuant to Rule 2.215 (b)(3), Florida Rules of Judicial Administration, shall develop an administrative plan for the efficient and proper administration of all courts within the circuit; and

**Whereas**, the Fourteenth Judicial Circuit court operations have been substantially impacted by Hurricane Michael resulting is a need to monitor the jail population and to take appropriate action to insure the inmate population remains at a manageable and safe level.

**Now, therefore, it is ORDERED AND ADJUDGED** that Judge Joe Grammer shall act as the court's liaison to the Bay County Jail/Sheriff Department to address inmate population issues and requests from the sheriff department regarding release or bond conditions for specific inmates housed at the Bay County Jail. This authority is not intended to alter the authority of the case assigned judge, but is intended to be concurrent therewith.
